"Dare to Design – Spaces of Care" presents the year's best graduation projects

What happens when design gets involved? What role does it play between democratic erosion and ecological crises? From **4 September to 12 October**, the initiative **German Design Graduates**, supported by the German Design Council, will present the annual exhibition "Dare to Design – Spaces of Care" at the **Museum for Applied Arts Cologne (MAKK)**.

45 projects and concepts by emerging design talents address urgent issues and socio-political challenges of our time. In their diversity, the graduation projects reflect design's innovative power. Going beyond the traditional concept of design and pure form, they invite discussion on an expanded understanding of the discipline: design as a collective practice and an act of care.

The **press preview** will take place on **3 September at 5:30 pm** in the presence of the exhibitors and mentors from business and culture. During the tour, nine particularly outstanding projects will be presented as "Spotlights". At 7 pm, the exhibition will be officially opened by Dr Petra Hesse, Director MAKK, and Lutz Dietzold, CEO German Design Council. This will be followed by a panel talk between Julia Kostial, Director Foundation Deutsches Design Museum, and three mentors, offering an interdisciplinary change of perspective.
